



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IQAC and Feedback Review committee have adopted the form entitled-"Student Satisfaction Survey" framed by NAAC, UGC. This form has been uploaded in College website( www.gourmaha.org-Box-About-IQAC) Members of the IQAC and Feedback Review Committee have collected 100 duly filled in forms.

- (1)80% students agreed that 85to 100% of syllabus was completed in due course.20%students mentioned that 70 to 84% of syllabus was covered during this session by faculty members. It seems to be that 20% students did not attend classes regularly due to long distance or their own problems.
- (2)85% students admitted that faculty members prepared for classes and discussed topics thoroughly.15% students mentioned that day to day teaching was satisfactory.
- (3)80%students agreed that teacher's communicative skill was always effective.20% students were of opinion that teachers' communicative skill was just satisfactory.
- (4)90% students mentioned that the teachers' approach to teaching was excellent. It may be mentioned that faculty members of Geography, History, English, Chemistry, Zoology, Botany, Computer Science, Mathematics and Chemistry used projector, screen and laptop. It means that Head of the Departments and their colleagues have adopted ICT in teaching.
- (5) 100 % students admitted that the internal evaluation was always fair.
