### 4.1. Physical Facilities (as per the minimum specified requirement by statutory bodies)

#### 4.1.1. The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning, viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment, etc.

As an educational Institution in the semi-urban location with vast remote rural hinterlands in Mukta District, West Bengal the vision of the college is to inculcate the spirit of education for empowerment, nurturing the inner potentialities and development of soft skills of students to make them prepare for global job markets, developing value systems and fraternity irrespective of caste, class, and gender.

Our mission is to become a premium institution in the state as well as in the country to offer fruitful education, training, counselling of its pupils for their all-round development by a balanced blend of traditional and advanced innovative academic practices. Introduction of new technology and soft skills oriented certificate/diploma courses, self-financed courses are the firm step of the institution towards the fulfilment of the global job market by making skilled and quality students. As students from both the town and the far-flung rural areas come to this institution, our aim is to reduce the rural-urban divide by providing relevant and quality education to all of them.

The college is built on an area of 2.44 acres (9792 square metres) with three-storied buildings for both Science and Arts sections. The physical infrastructure for teaching and learning are described as follows:

**4.1.2 The institution has adequate facilities for cultural activities, sports, games (indoor, outdoor), gymnasium, yoga center etc.**

The institution has one small playground where games like short put, kho kho, long jump, high jump, kabaddi, etc. are performed. For other outdoor sports, the college uses the playground of the local municipality (Ghoram, Moluk). The College organizes annual sports where the students play all the events, and the position holders are rewarded with prizes.

The department of Physical Education organizes the events every year. Students of the Department of Physical Education are facilitated by sports uniforms along with sports shoes. The college has a football team which takes part in state-level inter-college football tournament every year (Documents from Hareesh et al and Apurba Das). Annual Yoga day has been celebrated in the college every year by the department of Physical Education (Apurba Das).

The institution organizes annual cultural competition as well as annual cultural function where students participate in different cultural events like, singing, recitation, dance, debate, quiz competition, Mock Parliament, drama etc. For this purpose the department of Bengali and English gives the participants on a regular basis. The Department of Political Science organizes a Mock Parliament competition where students act as ministers of different departments and take part in the real issues facing the country. The students also participate in state-level and national-level mock parliament (Koushik).

A language laboratory is decided to be set up in the academic session 2020-2021. A gymnasium has been set-up in the academic session 2019-2020 for both the students and teachers.
