

Introducing the Course

The ADD-ON course on *Translation Studies: New Frontiers and Job Opportunities* was a huge success as students enthusiastically participated and interacted with the invited speakers. The course was organised from 16 August- 16 September 2022. 35 students enrolled for this 30 hour course.

Outcome of the Course

As Translation Studies is an important field of academic study and practice the ADD-ON course organised by the Department of English achieved the following objectives:

- The course introduced the students to the knowhow of translation. It empowered them to undertake translation on their own.
- As India is a polyglot country, the Bhasa Literatures from different regions of India should be translated into different regional languages for cultural interaction between different regions. This course, we are sure, would enable the students to take up such activities in future.
- As there are new opportunities for job for the translators today, the course addressed the problem of job creation.
