## **15.Multidisciplinary** / interdisciplinary

The college has embraced an interdisciplinary approach to enrich the teaching-learning process, empowering students in the development of knowledge, problem-solving skills, and self-confidence. This innovative approach involves teachers from various science departments conducting a minimum of two classes per week, irrespective of their specific disciplines. Similarly, educators from different humanities departments actively contribute to interdisciplinary teaching.

To foster a well-rounded learning experience, teachers from the Department of Mathematics conduct classes in different science and humanities departments. Furthermore, a reciprocal distribution of classes occurs between the Department of Education and History, Sanskrit, Bengali, Sociology, Political Science, creating a diverse and interconnected curriculum.

The Bishakha Cell (Gender Equity) is uniquely run by departments such as English, Bengali, Sociology, Political Science, and History, showcasing a collaborative effort to provide students with a comprehensive understanding of the subject matter.

Under the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS) syllabus, every student is required to study Environmental Studies as Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC). This emphasizes the pivotal role played by teachers from the Department of Environmental Science in contributing to the interdisciplinary teaching-learning process.

This comprehensive approach not only enhances the academic experience but also prepares students with a holistic skill set for real-world challenges.

#### **16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):**

The Academic Bank of Credit (ABC), as outlined in the National Education Policy, offers students enrolled in undergraduate (UG) programs multiple entry and exit options. This flexibility allows students to exit and re-enter the course within a stipulated period. The ABC is designed to facilitate academic mobility, enabling students to study across various Higher Education Institutions in the country through an efficient credit transfer mechanism. This can lead to the attainment of certificates, diplomas, degrees, and more.

In alignment with these directives, the University of Gour Banga, to which our college is affiliated, has officially mandated the registration of all students with ABC through www.abc.gov.in. It is now compulsory for every student to obtain an ABC ID. Additionally, the university has urged students to register themselves on Digilocker at www.dogilocker.gov.in. This will enable them to access electronic copies of their academic credentials.

As per the latest notification from Gour Mahavidyalaya, registration with ABC and Digilocker has been declared mandatory starting from the 2023-2024 academic session. This initiative aims to streamline and modernize the academic processes, providing students with a secure and accessible repository for their educational records. Students are encouraged to comply with these requirements to ensure a smooth academic experience and to stay aligned with the evolving educational landscape.

#### **17.Skill development:**

To ensure the success of students in their future occupations, the college recognizes the paramount importance of equipping them with essential skills. Under the guidance of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), the Career Counselling Cell, and the Incubation Centre, the college has initiated numerous projects aimed at enhancing the skill development and employability of its students. Complementing the regular curriculum, the college has introduced specialized courses designed to enable students to acquire practical skills relevant to their chosen professions. These initiatives encompass opportunities for entrepreneurship, internships, and experiential learning.

The college is committed to providing comprehensive career services to students, facilitated through career workshops, practice interviews, and networking opportunities. Seminars, training camps, and workshops dedicated to professionalism development are regularly hosted to further enhance students' preparedness for their future careers. Collaborative programs with businesses and organizations in specific sectors, as exemplified by the Department of Food & Nutrition, offer students valuable practical experiences.

The CBCS curriculum incorporates skill enhancement courses, ensuring a well-rounded education. Examples include Academic Writing (English), Indian Heritage (History), Legislative Practices, Procedures, and Democratic Awareness (Political Science), Public Opinion and Survey Research (Political Science), and Essay Writing and Communication Skills (Arabic). Furthermore, specialized courses like Electrical Circuit Network Skill & Computational Physics (Physics) contribute to the development of technical skills.

Mentoring programs, featuring interactions with experts in relevant fields, provide students with invaluable guidance and advice. Ultimately, the college places a high priority on skill development to ensure that students are not only academically proficient but also well-prepared for success in their future occupation.

The IQAC has taken special initiative to sign MoU with various sectors other than education to make students graduate from the institute with hands-on experience and better job opportunity.

Skill Enhancement Courses are offered as part of the syllabus in different Courses, like SEC-1 Sensor Network and IOT, internet Technology and Web Design in the Department of Computer Science, Survey on Sanitation and Nutrition, Literacy Campaign in the Department of Education, Business Communication and Academic Writing in English, Gymnastic and Yoga in Department of Physical Education so on and so forth.

Following order from the Tourism Department, Government of West Bengal, a special documentary on the tourism prospect of the district of Malda was made. This promoted skill for documentary making among students of the Department of Mass Communication and Journalism.

**18.**Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

While the University of Gour Banga has not enforced mandatory training programs in the Indian Knowledge System (IKS) for college and university teachers, the institution actively transmits the spirit of this scheme through diverse programs and initiatives. The college has wholeheartedly embraced the essence of IKS by integrating innovative learning experiences and courses inspired by the rich heritage of ancient India.

For example, distinctive programs have been introduced, such as exploring Chemistry, History, and Sanskrit through the lens of Ayurveda, and incorporating Yoga Practices for health and physique. Additionally, the college delves into Mathematics within the knowledge bank of ancient India, and the History department has introduced a noteworthy certificate course on Indian Heritage, providing students with an opportunity to immerse themselves in the depth of Indian culture. Although specific credit-based sessions related to IKS have not been formally designated, the institution has taken an initial step by introducing a 36-hour Museology course, with plans to expand the curriculum to include courses on archaeological artefacts, temple icons, and other aspects of India's rich cultural heritage.

In an effort to preserve the undocumented and Oral History of the district of Malda, the college established the Abid Ali Khan Center for Digital Archive and Translation of Cultures. This center focuses on preserving the various aspects of Vaishnavism, Shaivism, and Sufism in the middle part of Bengal.

A pioneering initiative involves offering Bengali, Sanskrit, and Arabic language courses to students, promoting linguistic diversity, and fostering cultural understanding across linguistic differences. This unique approach underscores the college's commitment to embracing and celebrating a rich tapestry of languages and cultures. International Arabic Language Day, International Mother Language Day are observed. Seminars focusing on Aryabhatta's astronomical treatise, Aryabhatiya geometry, further exemplify the institution's dedication to the principles of the Indian Knowledge System (IKS).

Established in 2019, the Gaudiya Sanskrit Parishad in the college enhances knowledge regarding the rich history of Gour and the cultural heritage in and around Gour. Reading discussions of Dharmashastras, Mahabharata, and Arthashastra are undertaken under the aegis of this Center in collaboration with other departments of the college.

#### **19.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):**

Outcome-Based Education (OBE) serves as a framework designed to articulate and measure the learning outcomes by systematically assessing them in comparison to predefined expectations. The college employs a comprehensive evaluation process that scrutinizes the skills and knowledge acquired by students at various stages before reaching the final examination. The assessment phases include class tests, tutorials, internal assessments, and the ultimate final examination.

Through OBE, the college continually measures educational effectiveness by comparing outcomes from entry level throughout the academic sessions. This allows for the identification of both slow and advanced learners, contributing to a nuanced understanding of individual student progress.pp

Recognizing that time spent in regular classes is a crucial factor in OBE, teachers actively enhance student engagement in the learning process through diverse methods such as projects, students' seminars, conferences, and field tours. Project reports play a pivotal role in evaluating and redesigning curriculum delivery and teaching materials. The Academic Subcommittee reviews these reports, contributing to the redesign of courses to promote the acquisition of higher-order knowledge and skills, moving away from conventional curriculum approaches.

Renewed teaching methods are continually adopted to enhance the effectiveness of teaching and learning. Through seminars, certificate courses, add-on courses, and excursions, teachers transcend traditional barriers, imparting knowledge that aligns with the principles of OBE. This approach has resulted in graduates who are notably more successful compared to those from previous years who were educated under traditional teaching and learning methods.

In essence, the college's commitment to Outcome-Based Education has not only transformed the assessment and learning process but has also elevated the success and preparedness of its graduates for the challenges of the evolving academic and professional landscape.

#### **20.Distance education/online education:**

The onset of the pandemic necessitated a shift to online instruction for the college. In response, during the later part of the 2021-2022 academic session, the institution took proactive measures, including the introduction of add-on, certificate, and collaborative regular courses, to facilitate a more widespread acceptance of online and remote learning. Recognizing the importance of technology in education, the college invested in a Learning Management System (LMS) to enhance the online learning experience. To cater to diverse student preferences, the college provides the option of synchronous virtual classes and employs a hybrid education model. Hybrid courses integrate both online and in-person elements, combining the benefits of traditional face-to-face interactions with the flexibility of online learning. This approach has been wellreceived by students who value the advantages of both formats.

The college has further expanded its reach by collaborating with online learning platforms to encourage students to enrol for SWAYAM courses, NPTEL and so on. Group discussions and student seminar presentations conducted in virtual mode have successfully recreated the interactive classroom environment, fostering real-time connections between students and professors.

Acknowledging the importance of accessibility, the college hosts study centers for Netaji Subhas Open University (NSOU) and Rabindra Bharati University (RBU). These centers provide flexible online and distance learning opportunities, accommodating students who may face challenges attending in-person sessions due to work, family, or other responsibilities. The institution is committed to ensuring that distance education programs for maintaining the same level of rigor and quality as their in-person counterparts.

In summary, the college has proactively adapted to the challenges posed by the pandemic, embracing a variety of instructional modes and technologies to provide students with a dynamic and accessible learning experience.

1.1.2 - The institution adheres to the academic calendar including for the conduct of Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE)

The college meticulously prepares a central Academic Calendar in alignment with the University of Gour Banga. This calendar specifies key dates such as the commencement of classes and examinations. It also outlines various other activities, including seminars, special lectures, student-led seminars, tutorial and remedial classes, the commencement and announcement of results for internal evaluations, field trips, and excursions. The college ensures that all planned activities are conducted promptly.

The syllabus and detailed teaching plans are uploaded to the college Learning Management System (LMS), accessible to all students. Monthly attendance reports are required by the Principal from each department. Through mentoring, teachers investigate the reasons behind student absenteeism and make necessary interventions where appropriate. Continuous internal assessments are conducted to evaluate student performance. During the pandemic, many teachers adapted by conducting evaluations online using multiple-choice questions (MCQs), Viva through G-meet, and Google Forms. Based on class responses and performance in class tests, remedial classes are scheduled for students who require additional support.

To ensure adherence to the academic calendar, the Internal Quality

Assurance Cell (IQAC) conducts an internal academic audit, supplemented by external audits from academic experts as needed. These audits cover all curricular and extracurricular activities, ensuring comprehensive compliance and quality in academic delivery.

#### 2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

After admission, the college conducts a 'Student Aptitude Test' to map and assess the academic, social, and intellectual backgrounds of students. Teachers evaluate students' competence levels based on their academic performance in examinations, classroom interactions, and participation in discussions. Advanced learners identified through this process are granted access to e-journals, advanced e-books, and other e-resources from NLIST, based on recommendations from departmental faculties. Advanced students are advised to enrol in different SWAYAM, MOOC courses. These students are encouraged to present at student seminars, participate in relevant seminars and workshops, made teaching assistants for practical classes from the previous semester, and contribute to wall magazines, to engage in various research-based activities.

The library is well-equipped with a variety of resources, including books focused on career guidance and preparation for entrance and competitive examinations. Departmental faculty specifically encourage advanced learners to utilize these resources.

Regular mentoring sessions are held for slow learners to identify and address the causes of their academic challenges. Academic issues are discussed in class, and strategies are formulated based on evaluations from internal assessments. Remedial classes are organized for slow learners, and complimentary books are provided by departmental faculty to aid their learning. Special classes are conducted for appearing in NET, SLET, SET, NIMSET, JECA, CUET and so on. Additionally, parent-teacher meetings are scheduled as needed to discuss academic progress and resolve issues.

Faculty members are adept at utilizing technology to engage with a larger number of students, transcending traditional classroom boundaries. This extensive application of technology ensures that learning becomes more accessible, allowing students to learn anytime, anywhere.

The college boasts a Wi-Fi-enabled campus and ICT-enabled classrooms equipped with projectors, facilitating e-learning initiatives. An Automated Library with WEB-OPAC facility and access to NLIST ensures that students have easy access to eresources. Additionally, the college maintains well-equipped computer laboratories in Physics, Mathematics, and Computer Science, alongside state-of-the-art science laboratories. The Geography laboratory is updated with cutting-edge software such as QGIS Software.

Various software applications including Python, IDLE 3.7, GNU Plot, C, C++, JAVA SDK, DEV C++, UNIX (UBUNTU), WAMPP, XAMPP, PYCHARM, MYSQL, NETBIN, Q-GIS 3.0, MS Office, SCI LAB, ORIGIN, PSPICE, and V-HDL are utilized by different departments to enhance teaching and research activities. Students are encouraged to utilize tools such as MS Word, MS PowerPoint, and MS Excel for preparing presentations, assignments, projects, and field reports. ## 2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

Gour Mahavidyalaya, affiliated with the University of Gour Banga, strictly adheres to the university's regulations concerning examination and evaluation procedures. The college prioritizes transparency and fairness in continuous internal assessment.

Under the University's Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) implemented since 2019, non-practical based subjects allocate 36% of marks for internal evaluation. This includes 8% for attendance, 12% for Internal Assessment exams (IA) and 16% for tutorial examinations. For practical-based subjects, 30% of marks are designated for practical examinations, in addition to the 20% allotted for attendance and 12% allotted for IA .

Monthly attendance records are maintained by departments and communicated to students regularly. Mentors engage with students with low attendance, offering guidance and taking necessary steps as needed. The college follows the internal and tutorial examination patterns prescribed by the University of Gour Banga. Internal assessment exams are conducted centrally, with departmental faculty submitting marks, which are then recorded by the college.

Tutorial examinations follow university guidelines and encompass various assessment methods such as term papers, projects, written tests, group discussions, and presentations, varying across departments. Additionally, departments organize regular class tests to monitor students' progress, with remedial classes arranged for those needing additional support.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time- bound and efficient

Gour Mahavidyalaya operates separate Examination Committees for each of its six semesters, overseeing internal and university exams and addressing related grievances. Answer scripts of internal tests and assignments are openly discussed with students, with any discrepancies in marks promptly rectified. Monthly attendance records are regularly shared with students, and flexibility is provided for medical or extracurricular reasons.

Students unable to sit exams due to valid reasons can undergo internal assessments upon submission of proper documentation. Grievances regarding university-level exams are communicated to the university, and students dissatisfied with marks can request a review of their answer scripts, following RTI guidelines.

The Examination Committee, led by the Principal and senior faculty, resolves grievances initially unresolved at the departmental level. Grievances are effectively communicated to the university through the RTI and Grievance Redressal Cells, overseen by the IQAC Coordinator and/or Principal.

Any issues with university question papers, external practical exams, or results are forwarded to the university through the Principal. Teachers play an active role in resolving grievances, and concerns about admit cards, subject codes, or exam dates are promptly reported to the university.

In exceptional cases, the Principal may involve the educational and Psychological Counselling Cell. Remedial coaching classes may also be offered to support students in enhancing their learning and performance.

## **4.3 - IT Infrastructure**

Gour Mahavidyalaya prides itself on its robust technological infrastructure, featuring 120 computers (desktops and laptops) regularly updated to meet evolving needs. Seminar rooms have been upgraded to support virtual class setups, and the college boasts full Wi-Fi connectivity with 5 access points delivering a 100 MBPS bandwidth. Additionally, KOHA, the library software, has been upgraded to a cloud version for enhanced accessibility.

Various departments leverage specialized software to bolster teaching and research endeavors. For example, the Geography department utilizes paid software like State of Art UGIS, 22 Laptops for Faculty Members to take class, while departments like Physics, Mathematics, Computer Science, and Chemistry utilize a range of free and paid software tailored to their specific needs. ORELL Software has been purchased for running Language Lab under the Department of English.

To modernize educational delivery, the college has replaced Teaching Aid Software with a comprehensive Learning Management System (LMS). An online admission system has been introduced, simplifying processes such as mark submission, result declaration, and generation of internal examination marksheets and attendance percentages. Additionally, an examination software facilitates the smooth conduct of university examinations.

Regular online feedback from stakeholders informs ongoing improvements, ensuring the college stays responsive to evolving needs. Office software such as Tally ERP and file tracking systems are employed to streamline administrative operations. Furthermore, the college website receives meticulous maintenance and upgrades under an annual contract with Gen Next Information Technology, ensuring it remains a reliable and accessible hub of information for students, faculty, and stakeholders.

Title: Advancing Teaching-Learning with ICT Integration and Student Empowerment Initiatives

Promotion of ICT Tools in Teaching-Learning Process:

In its commitment to enhancing teaching quality and fostering effective learning outcomes, the college emphasizes the integration of ICT tools. Under the directive of IQAC, ICT tool usage is made mandatory for all faculty members. Each department hosts at least one ICT-enabled classroom, supported by the provision of 22 laptops distributed among teachers. Furthermore, the college avails various Wi-Fi networks on rental basis to facilitate connectivity.

To ensure faculty readiness for the digital era, the Computer Science department organizes numerous ICT-oriented teacher training programs upon IQAC's request. Best Practices - II

Women and Student Empowerment:

Aligned with the Sustainable Development Goals, Gour Mahavidyalaya prioritizes women empowerment. To this end, the Sibnarayan Chakraborty Merit Scholarship has been initiated from internal funds. This scholarship aims to alleviate financial burdens and encourage female students to pursue higher education. Exclusively awarded to single female children, the scholarship recipients are selected based on academic merit and economic background. In its inaugural edition, Moumita Kundu, pursuing her Masters in Bengali at Banaras Hindu University, was awarded the scholarship.

Additionally, in accordance with UGC guidelines, the college has introduced the Earn While You Learn Program (EWYL). Following an interview process, six students were selected to assist faculty members and engage in official tasks within various college departments, including the Theater Corner, NSS, Library, and Abid Ali Khan Center.
