

Gour Mahavidyalaya, situated on the left bank of Mahananda river where N.H.34 passes through Mangalbari, Old Malda, started its journey in the year 1985 (5.11.1985) to cater to the needs of the pupil, mainly of the locality, as well as those of this district and of entire North Bengal, in the field of higher education. SECTION 2: IMPORTANT GUIDELINES AND INFORMATION FOR ATTANDANCE Admission General Guideline

- 1. 1st year admission of Undergraduate Programme in Gour Mahavidyalaya for academic session 2023-2024 will commence through Admission Portal of our Web site. Portal link will be given in due course.
- 2. Candidates seeking admission must have to secure the qualifying pass marks including English at the Higher Secondary (H.S.), or its equivalent Examination.
- 3. During admission, the marks of the best **four** subjects at the Higher Secondary (H.S.), or its equivalent Examination will be considered. These four best subjects must include **English**.
- 4. Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examinations in the current year, immediate previous year and the year before the previous year, i.e., 2023, 2022, and 2021 will only be allowed to take admission.
- 5. To know more about the Merit Marks Calculations, Tie Breaking Rule and detailed subject seat matrix, on our College Web site.

Minimum eligibility criteria:

(i) 4-Year UG Degree (Honours / Honours with Research): A student who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination held by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent Examination from other Boards / Councils with at least four subjects having English as Compulsory Subject of 100 marks is eligible to take admission to the Honours Programmes of Studies of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./B.C.A. on the basis of merit and available vacancy of the particular subject(s) of the concerned college.

(ii) 3-Year UG Degree: A student who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination held by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent Examination from other Boards/Councils with at least four subjects having English as Compulsory Subject of 100 marks is eligible to take admission to the General Programmes of Studies of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com, on the basis of merit and available vacancy of the particular subject(s) of the concerned college.

(iii) A student who has passed Higher Secondary (10+2) examinations (with English as a subject) of the West Bengal State Council of Technical & Vocational Education and Skill Development or any equivalent Courses from National or State Level Board in regular mode shall be eligible to take admission to the 3-Year UG Degree Programme only.

(iv) NRI: In case of any NRI applicant the College Authority should seek permission from the University Authority as well as from appropriate Authority.

(v) Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examinations in the current year, immediate previous year and the year before the previous year will only be allowed to take admission.

(vi) Aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks in top-four subjects, including Marks obtained in English, in order of marks secured by a candidate. Marks obtained in Compulsory Environmental Studies (if any) shall not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate marks.

The selection criteria and merit will be prepared as per the provisions of the University. The Merit Point Calculation will be done as follows:

a) Subject to the eligibility criteria, the merit lists for the 4-Year UG Degree (Honours / Honours with Research) Courses will be prepared as:

i) (S+T)/4

[Where S = Subject marks (opted for Honours Course) and T = Marks obtained in English + best marks of two other subjects].

ii) In case, any candidate opts for an Honours Course beyond his/her subject combination [except linguistic subjects at H.S. (10+2) level], the merit point will be calculated as: $T_1/4$.

[Where T = Marks obtained in English + best marks of three other subjects (excluding English)].

b) Subject to the eligibility criteria, the merit lists for the 3-Year UG Degree Course will be prepared as:

$T_{1}/4$

[Where T, = Marks obtained in English + best marks of three other subjects (excluding English)].

(vii) Special conditions for admission: A student shall be allowed to take up a subject in any Programme if he /she have passed in that subject at the qualifying examination. However, a student shall be allowed to take up the subject(s) under Column 'A' it he /she have passed the subject(s) under Column 'B' at the qualifying examination

* Applications from the candidates passed through Distance mode of Education will NOT be entertained.

Main Focuses on NEP-2020

- Although this course is of four years, all the students have to study the same syllabus for the first three years.
- Honours or research with honours in the **4th year** will be determined if the candidate gets the specified marks as per university norms in the examination at the end of the third year.

- If a student wants to discontinue his/her study after the first year, he/she must inform this to college at the beginning of **2nd Sem** and he/she must complete the process of Internship. Then He/she will be eligible to get **Certificate** from university on completion of the first year.
- If a student wants to discontinue his/her study after the 2nd year, he/she must inform this to college at the beginning of **4th Sem** and he/she must complete the process of Internship. Then He/she will be eligible to get **Diploma** from university on completion of the 2nd year.
- If a student wants to discontinue his/her study after the 3rd year, he/she must inform this to college at the beginning of **6th Sem**. Then He/she will be eligible to get **UG Degree** from university on completion of the 3rd year.
- At the end of **four years**, the University will award the 4-Year UG Degree (Honours / Honours with Research) degree.

Students taking this course should study the following Category of subjects:

- a) Major Core (MC) Courses,
- b) Minor Core (MnC) Courses,
- c) Discipline Specific Core (DSC) Courses,
- d) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC),
- e) Ability Enhancement Compulsory (AEC) Courses,
- f) Value addition Courses (VAC),
- g) Interdisciplinary / Multidisciplinary Course (IDC/MDC)
- h) Internship / Apprenticeship / Project / Community Outreach Courses
- In Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) and Semester System you have to get fixed credit points in eight semesters for four years. A student can opt for research subject in the fourth year if he fulfils all the specified conditions (Students of 4-Year UG Degree (Honours / Honours with Research) course who secure certain marks specified by University in the first six semesters and wish to pursue research at graduate level in the fourth year One can choose a research stream.)
- Once the program (B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./B.C.A) is specified the program cannot be changed without the permission of the prescribed authority of the University.
- After admission Undergraduate students of the University have to register themselves for Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) through <u>http://www.abc.gov.in/</u>.

Major Minor Subject Combination for BA & BSC

Every student studies one major subject from subject-1 & two Minor subjects, one from Subject -2 and another from Subject-3. In addition with Discipline Specific Courses (DSC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Ability Enhancement Compulsory (AEC) Courses, Multidisciplinary / Interdisciplinary Course (MDC / IDC), Value Addition Courses (VAC), Internship/ Apprenticeship / Project / Community Outreach Courses must be studies.

IMPORTANT NOTES AFTER ADMISSION

Points to remember after admission

- 1. Students must attend the **ORIENTATION PROGRAM** after taking admission.
- 2. Students must carry the Student ID Card when present within the College Campus regularly.
- **3.** A student must have **a minimum 75% class attendance** as per the norms of UGB to appear in the University Examination and get internal Marks as per University Norms.
- 4. For Govt. Scholarship students have to follow the respective scholarship website for notification, last date of application and renewal date. College does not make any separate notification in this regard.
- Students must follow the college notice and academic calendar available on the college website (www.gourmaha.ac.in) and also follow the departmental group for academic purposes.
- 6. Students must get registered through the university portal for obtaining University Registration Number and submit the Acknowledgement Slip for approval in the college office. Since the University portal remains active for a limited time period, students should follow the college website for relevant notice in this regard.
- 7. Registered Students should check the university portal for obtaining Admit Card after university exam form fill up and submit the Acknowledgement Slip and Payment Slip for approval in the college office. Since the University portal remains active for a limited time period, students should follow the college website for relevant notice in this regard.

All new admitted students must follow the Student Road Map Activities during study at Gour Mahavidyalaya.

Some other important notes after admission

- 1. Students are required to bring their student identity cards to college on a regular basis and to produce them when required. The loss of an identity card must be reported immediately to the office, and it will be replaced upon payment of the associated fees. The card must be submitted to the college office in the event of a transfer or withdrawal from the college.
- 2. Regular class attendance is compulsory for every student of the College for getting internal marks as per university norms.

- 3. A student will be considered as Non-collegiate, if her/his attendance in any subject / group of subjects falls short of 75% but not below 60%. Candidates declared Non collegiate may be allowed to fill in application forms for examination on payment of requisite Non-collegiate fees.
- 4. The Anti-ragging Cell of the college is very strong to function in every respect and students are sworn never to rag. Fortunately, no case of ragging in any form has occurred so far. After admission every student and their parents / guardians are instructed to fill up an online Anti Ragging Undertaking at the University Grant Commission (UGC) Web Portal as per the orders issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court
- 5. For Govt. Scholarship students have to follow the respective scholarship website for notification, last date of application and renewal date. College does not make any separate notification in this regard.
- 6. All the students shall go to their classes in time without disturbing other classes.
- 7. No student should be found loitering in the corridors.
- 8. No student is permitted to act indecently or involve in any unruly activity with his or her fellow students.
- 9. Students should maintain a sense of decorum at all times both inside and outside the College. Those who are found guilty of serious misconduct may invite punishment, including expulsion as permitted by regulations.
- **10.** Scribbling on walls or desks, loitering on the campus, defacing the building is reprehensible and will attract punishment.
- 11. Students are advised to see the notice board regularly for important announcements.
- **12.** Possession of Identity Cards is compulsory within the campus, and it must be produced whenever asked for.
- **13.** Students must not entertain any outsider in the College or invite members of any student organisation without the permission of the Principal.
- 14. Gathering on the road or at the entrance or anywhere around the College causes problems to passers-by and should be avoided.
- 15. Cooperation of students is solicited in maintaining cleanliness of the campus.
- 16. Students are warned NOT to indulge in Ragging. It is a serious and punishable offence.


