

Overview

IQAC in Gour Mahavidyalaya in collaboration with MMTTC, University of North Bengal planned a Teacher Training Program (FDP) to meet the various objectives of NEP 2020 in higher educational institutions. The main objective of the course was to equip the faculty members on how to adopt an expansive perspective on IKS and meet its avowed agenda to decolonise the education system. Subsequently, ICSSR-ERC agreed to sponsor the course and 16 renowned educationists, scholars, and public intellectuals joined this course to make it enormously productive. The Keynote was delivered by **Professor Akeel Bilgrami** from **Columbia University**, **New York**. There were 16 moderators from different institutions and disciplines for all the sessions. **Dr. Saptarshi Mallick** joined the course as a moderator from the **University of Graz in Poland**, whereas **Professor Himadri Lahiri** from **Netaji Subhas Open University (Kolkata)** moderated the Keynote session on 18 September, 2025.

Course Objective

- 1. To provide a comprehensive understanding of IKS from the perspective of Humanities Education.
- 2. To offer a multi-disciplinary optic as contributors belong to six different disciplines: Sanskrit, Literatures, Sociology, Political Science, Philosophy and History.
- 3. To provide concrete ideas as to how IKS can be implemented in everyday classroom teachings.
- 4. To encourage interdisciplinary methodologies to promote research in IKS.
- 5. To meet the paucity of quality Text Books in the emerging field of IKS.
- 6. To explore diverse thought traditions from Eastern India that emerged in different historical periods.


Milestones

I. Number of Participation

1120 (714 females + 406 males) Participants from all over India registered for the Course.


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Preferred Mode of Participation

II. Number of Participants who completed the Course

Later, 280 Participants including 11 participants working in the capacity of Professorship from across the length and breadth of India confirmed their participation and all of them successfully completed the course.

III. ICSSR's sponsorship

ICSSR-ERC was approached with a detailed application to get their funding for the course. ICSSR-ERC, after rounds of rigorous review, agreed to fund the course, which made it a unique course with ICSSR-ERC's sponsorship and MMTTC, University of North Bengal's recognition. Two Central bodies became part of it.

IV. Keynote Address

Professor Akeel Bilgrami from University of California agreed to give the keynote for the course, which made it truly International in scope and potential.

V. Hybrid Mode

There were 41 participants in Offline mode and most of them are faculty members working in different colleges affiliated to the University of Gour Banga (UGB). Since

UGB has no MMTTC Center, this course gave them first hand exposure to a training program in their vicinity.

VI. Interdisciplinary Course Module

The course touched upon four disciplines that include History, Sanskrit, Literature and Philosophy. Lectures were planned to accommodate resource persons from all over India that includes Jawaharlal Nehru university, Delhi University, Kumaon University, Assam University, Jadavpur University, Visva-Bharati, Rabindra Bharati University, University of North Bengal among others.

Conclusion:

After the successful completion of this course, efforts are underway to publish the recorded videos in the official YouTube channel of Gour Mahavidyalaya. Further, an edited volume with essays has been planned on this theme to provide necessary materials for introducing a course on IKS at higher educational institutions.






Imagining Visva-Bharati as a research centre

- Scholars across the world would be invited to come to Santiniketan to work together creating a co-operative of minds.










Introduction

- In the Indian knowledge systems, what is meant by 'knowledge' (pramā/pramāņa) was not spelt out in clear terms prior to the aphorisms of Gautama whose time is believed to be 6th century BCE to 2nd century CE.
- Though this time span matches with the period when Buddhism was becoming popular throughout the country, Buddha did not concentrate much on providing any definition of knowledge, may be because such discussion was not relevant in the goal of His philosophy, namely complete cessation of human suffering.








































