FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Gour Mahavidyalaya, situated on the left bank of Mahananda river where N.H.34 passes through Mangalbari, Old Malda, started its journey in the year 1985 (5.11.1985) to cater to the needs of the pupil, mainly of the locality, as well as those of this district and of entire North Bengal, in the field of higher education. Gour Mahavidyalaya, a premier institution for higher education of Old Malda constituency, has been trying continuously to free people from ignorance, superstition and many wrong ideas on the one hand and empower the students to earn a decent living on the other. The college, which started with Humanities and Social Sciences, had only 35 students at the initial stage. As the days rolled on, the number of students increased and the college morphed into a leading academic institute of the district. The college is affiliated to the University of Gour Banga and it was recognised as per UGC 2f and 12b in the year 1992. The college has only day shift operating from 10.30 am. to 5.30 p.m. Now, with Honours in 18 subjects in Arts & Science, Pass course in Physical Education, self-financed course in BCA, the college boasts of satisfying the needs of more than six thousand students today. We are glad to inform that the college recently completed the second cycle of NAAC securing B+ (the highest rank in Malda district) and we resolve to carry forward the momentum for further development of the college.

MISSION & VISION

Keeping in mind the vision and mission of the Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal and MHRD, Government of India, the college strives for an all-round development of the students and to prepare them as conscious and responsible citizen of the country. In consonance with the demands of globalised knowledge economy, the mission of the college is to develop human resource through theoretical knowledge and vocational expertise. The college aims at creating thinkers as well as innovators who can make a mark through their original and pertinent ideas.

Being the premier institution in a semi-urban area dominated by SC, ST, OBC and Minority students (52% of the total student), the college has a particular mission of mainstreaming such peripheral and marginalised sections of the society by empowering them through education, training and counselling. As part of its outreach programme and social responsibility, the college, with its NSS units, engages in community building programmes, awareness programmes, and fights against untouchability and other such social evils. The Ambedkar Study Centre, founded under the UGC scheme of Epoch Making Social Thinkers of India, made significant contribution in this regard and we plan to carry on with such endeavours.

Forty percent of the total students of the college are girls who come from far flung villages. The vision of the college is to empower them through proper education and counselling so that they can fight the gender bias in society and as conscious citizen of the country contribute in the nation building. As part of that the college has already constructed a women's hostel and wants to open a centre for Women's Studies.

As students from both the town and the far flung rural areas come to this institution, our aim is to reduce the rural urban divide by providing relevant and quality education to all of them. The economically poor but potential students are offered financial help through Half-free, Full-free and Poor Fund to complete their desired degree and make them prepare for job. Students from marginalised sections of the society, in terms of caste, class, religion and gender, are offered remedial coaching and coaching for entry into services to help them to compete in the job market. The college is going to set up a language lab to help the students from the marginalized sections of society to correct their pronunciation and develop their communicative skills.

Keeping in mind the demands of the changing knowledge and service economy, the college runs departments like Computer Science, Bachelor of Computer Application, Mass Communication and Journalism, Food and Nutrition

etc. We plan to offer several add-on courses for developing the soft skills of the students and providing them with necessary academic, vocational and technical expertise for grabbing prospective jobs.

Revenue generation is another aspect which the college takes seriously. As part of that the college has signed MOU with respective institutions and is able to give food safety licence and certified hallmark (FSSAI Registration) to various food business holders of the district. This consultation programme may act as a revenue earning process of the institution in a minimal scale and also can create job opening for the students of the institutions.

Our college is located in a district which has a very rich repertoire of folk cultural forms, such as Gambhira. Historically, Malda is famous for medieval sites like Gour and Pandua. The college aims at preserving as well as encouraging further study of rich history of Malda by founding a history museum in the college. The college started its journey in 1985 with only 35 students. But the college, within the short span of thirty three years, caters to the educational needs of 6382 students (session 2017-18). As the number of students is increasing every year, the college is aiming at academic diversification and expansion in the form of introducing new academic subjects and elevating several undergraduate departments to the post graduate level. The college finally wants to achieve autonomous status for smooth functioning and proper implementation of its mission and vision.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION INTO HONS. & GEN. COURSES

Admission to B.A/B.Sc. 1st year Honours and General courses is made strictly on the basis of merit. After thorough discussion with the authority of the University of Gour Banga the college decided to conduct online admission from 2015.

The eligibility criteria as furnished by the University of Gour Banga are- For regular Hons. Course-

(a) 45% marks in the aggregate

Or

(b) 40% marks in the aggregate and 50% marks in the subject.

(Calculation should be done including the marks of English & Excluding Environment science)

Merit Marks Calculation Formula is:
$$\frac{\text{Subject Marks} + \text{Total marks of best 5 subjects}}{6}$$

- Candidates who have passed the HS or its equivalent from Distance Education or Open School are not eligible for admission in 1st year.
- Candidates who have passed the HS or its equivalent without Arabic or Sanskrit are not eligible for studying Hons in the said subject at degree level.
- Vocational Course Candidates are only eligible for studying in general degree course in Arts.
- As per instruction of the Backward Class Welfare Department, Govt. of west Bengal,
 - i. 22% seats are reserved for SC students,
 - ii. 0.6% for ST Students,
 - iii. 2 seats in Each Hons, are for Physically Handicapped students out of total 113 seats.

LIBRARY:

The college library is a well-equipped one with approximately 30000 books. It has three well-furnished reading rooms, two for the students and the other for the teachers. It offers dailies, periodicals, journals, job news in an academically conducive environment. The Library is the academic hub of the institute. EPW, YOJONA, EMPLOYMENT NEWS, DESH, PASCHIM BANGA SIKSHA DARPAN etc. journals and magazines are available. Inlibnet facility with online journals, e-books from Taylor & Francis Group and Jstore is available for the teachers and the students.

LIBSYS is being used for Library automation. Data processing has been done. The Library remains open from 10 a.m. to 5.30 p.m.

CLASS ATTENDANCE: Students must attend classes regularly. If any student remains absent from the classes continuously for a period of 15 days or for a total of 30 days (interrupted) without justifiable reasons his/her studentship will be terminated. For appearing at the University examinations the requirement of attending 75% of the classes held is mandatory for every examinee.

Examination Centre:

University degree examination centre will be decided by the university.

Scholarship & Stipends:

Application of the SC/ST Students is forwarded to the SC/ST and Backward Class Welfare Department, Malda for stipends. Half free and full free studentship are awarded by college to the poor and meritorious students selected by the college. Applications of the students belonging to the BEEDI workers are forwarded to the Labour Welfare Organisation. The students of the college can avail of facilities of the STUDENTS' HEALTH HOME. The NSS unit of the college is going to adopt village as part of its community development programme.

PERSONALITY DEVELOPMENT MEASURES

For developing the academic competence and career oriented expertise of students the college offers myriad opportunities for personality development of the learners through participation in games, cultural programmes, wall magazines, seminars, social service programmes, coaching for services etc.

UGC approved Career Counselling Cell has been set up in the college which proposes to regularly hold career oriented programmes involving relevant persons from different centres of the state.

Through class test weak students are identified and are given extra coaching. Audio-visual aids are used to enliven classroom lectures.

In a free and frank manner the teachers counsel, guide and assist the students in solving educational as well as career related issues. Placement Centre is present in the college and campus recruitment is held regularly.

Gour Mahavidyalaya Alumni Association:

Alumni Association of the college organises reunion, cultural programmes and offers suggestions for the improvement of our college. The association donated Glow Sign Board for the main gate and they organised reunion on the occasion of the silver jubilee celebration.
